APS MARTYRS DAY CEREMONY



To express solidarity with the 147 martyrs, including 122 innocent school children of the Army Public School Peshawar, in one of the most horrific acts of terrorism ever witnessed, COMSATS Institute of Information Technology (CIIT) observed the first anniversary of the tragic incident to express solidarity with families of those who had lost their lives. Rector CIIT, Pro-Rector CIIT and In-charge Islamabad Campus paid homage to the martyrs in their separate messages and informed the audience that a delegation from CIIT will soon be visiting APS, Peshawar, on invitation from its administration.

The day started with *Fatiha* and prayers for the deceased souls. CIIT students expressed solidarity with the martyrs by wearing black arm bands, reciting poems and delivering speeches, prepared especially for the occasion. *Quran Khawani* was offered at the CIIT Mosque followed by a 'vigil march' by over 3,000 persons, including students from all departments, faculty members and staff. They marched and gathered in front of the library where they lighted candles and levitating lanterns.

CIIT's Centre for Policy Studies (CPS) also collaborated with Pakistan Sweet Homes, an orphanage, for organizing a similar vigil in Sector H-9, in which around 100 orphan children marched clad in army uniforms, along with students from CIIT and some other universities. Holding banners and placards with messages admiring the Pakistan Army and condemning terrorism, the event stirred emotions event when the little angels began singing tributes in the remembrance of the heroes of the tragic incident. Patron-in-chief Pakistan Sweet Homes Mr. Zamurrad Khan and Ambassador Fauzia Nasreen, Head CPS at CIIT also addressed the participants and prayed to the Almighty for spiritual strength so that the nation could rise from the tragedy much more resilient and determined to root out terrorism from society.

German Ambassador was extremely delighted to see the collection on and about Germany and German Language.



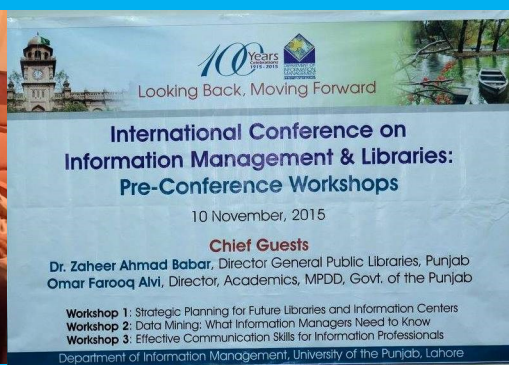
Inauguration of Japan Corner at CIIT (Islamabad Campus) Library

Pakistan Library Association Punjab Branch organized “South Asian Libraries Conference on "journey through print to digital information and beyond" held on 12-13 October 2015 at Lahore University of Management Sciences. More than 430 participants across Pakistan, including 8 Indian delegates attended the South Asian Libraries Conference. 40 research papers in three parallel sessions were presented, 7 online Skype presentations from Korea, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Poland, UK, USA and Canada with time differences were arranged, international scholars messages through net were arranged. Education Minister, Chairman PHEC, 10 VCs and Rectors, Registrars, DGs, Deans and Directors participated in the conference and chair the sessions.

The award was presented to him during the PLA South Asian Libraries Conference on "journey through print to digital information and beyond" held on 12-13 October 2015 at Lahore University of Management Sciences (LUMS). Conference Paper Presentation

Mr. Shahzad Abbas, Assistant Librarian, represented the CIIT Islamabad library at “PLA South Asian Libraries Conference” by presenting his paper in the conference. The title of his study was “**Acceptance of Mobile Phone Applications in University Libraries in Pakistan: An empirical study by using Technology Acceptance Model**”.

Abstract: The purpose of the study is to investigate the need of mobile technology in libraries of Pakistan by using Technology acceptance mode. The acceptance of new technology in libraries by students of higher education institute is evaluated in this study. 245 Students were surveyed for collecting data through questionnaire from library of higher education institute. Statistical techniques such as descriptive statistics, correlation, simple and multiple regressions were employed. This study employed technology acceptance model for evaluating the accepting behavior of mobile technology in the libraries. This study revealed that most of the student use mobile technology and for technology acceptance they require ease-of-use facilities. Perceived usefulness also have firm effect on the behavior of accepting the new technology in libraries. By basis of this study future research will be done to recognize the requirement of the students to launch this technology in higher education institution of Pakistan. This research is considered to be the initiative study toward the launching of mobile technology concept in the libraries of Pakistan which bring these libraries in new era of digitalization. The result obtain in this study provide reference for further research.

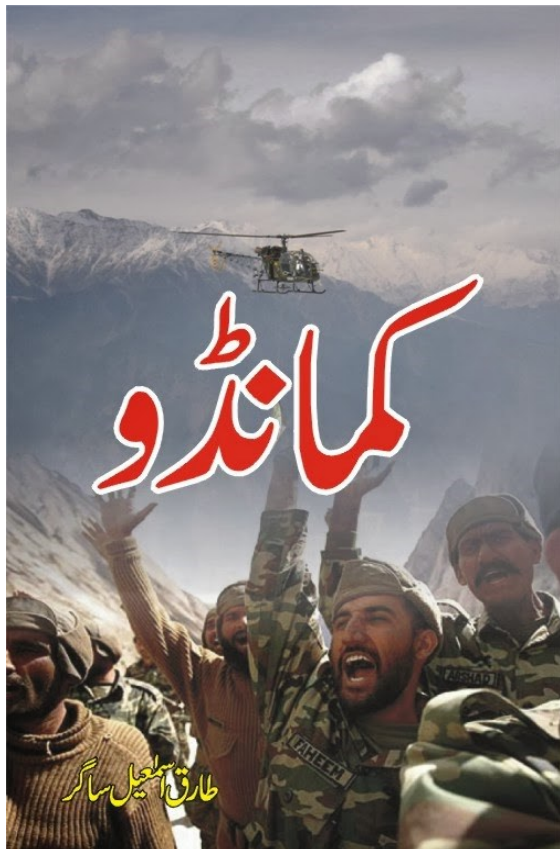

2003

The [Public Library of Science](#) (now PLOS) begins to publish PLOS Biology as a new and prominent open access journal.

The [Bethesda Statement on Open Access Publishing](#) defines an open access article as freely available and secured for posterity in a reliable digital repository.

2008

The US Congress approves a policy that requires all papers resulting from funding by the National Institutes of Health be made available through PubMed Central (open access) no later than 12 months after publication.

2010

The -Scholarly Publishing Roundtable in the US releases a [report](#) on how to improve access while respecting interests of publishers, librarians, and researchers.

2012

In the UK, the [Finch Report](#) lays out a strategy to ensure immediate open access to research funded by the government.

2013

The US Office of Science and Technology Policy issues a [directive](#) that all federal agencies must ensure that the research they fund will be open access.

2014

K|N Consultants launch the [Open Access Network](#), a strategy for cost-sharing and sustainable open access in the social sciences and humanities.

The library has acquired vast variety of hardbound volumes and reference material on subjects such as Business, Marketing, HRM, HRD, Management, Finance, Economics, Research, Computer Science, Mathematics, Bio-Sciences, Mechanical Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Social Sciences, English, Urdu, Islamic Literature, Pakistan Studies, Encyclopedias, Dictionaries, Atlases, Year Books, Handbooks, etc. The library has open shelf system with wide range of books, Audio-Visual Material, CDs, Data Bases, Newspapers, National and International Journals / Magazines, Thesis, Projects, etc. The facility of more than 30,000 online research journals / Magazines and more than 10,670 books on different subjects through HEC Digital Library Program, is also accessible here at Sahiwal.



Should Hackerspaces Replace Libraries?

Technology has made accessing information more equal but as it develops we need to ensure that access to the software and hardware is possible for all and not just the wealthiest. Converting public libraries into hackerspaces might be our way to do that.

Library use is on the decline. Since 2009, the number of branches open in Britain has fallen by 8%. In the same amount of time the number of total visits have dropped by 40 million. The amount of titles available, number of paid staff and size of budgets have also decreased. Despite this, 8 in every 10 people still see libraries as valuable. Why is it that they can be both valuable and under-used at the same time?

It's simple, we value the principles they embody; a collective commitment to establishing a place where we can come together to share ideas and educate ourselves. We do not, however, place the same value on the services they offer. In other words, we like the idea of having libraries but we just don't care as much about using them.

The internet has revolutionised how we ascertain information. We no longer have to endure the ceremony of searching the library catalogues, checking if the book is in stock and then hunting it down in the labyrinth of shelves. If we need information today, we use Google, Youtube or Amazon. In an age where information is in the ether, we no longer need physical monuments to the sum of human knowledge.

There is still a place for libraries in the modern world, we just have to reimagine what services they offer. Modern society is dependent on computers and yet hardly any of us know how to code, animate, edit video, create a design plan or use a 3D printer. This is as true for the younger generation as it is for the old, in 2014 only 2.6% of students attempted a computing GCSE and in the past 10 years the number of A-level students studying computing or IT has nearly halved - from 24,594 in 2004 to 13,650 in 2014.

Enter Hackerspaces. A 'hackerspace' (also referred to as a hacklab, makerspace or creative space) is a place where people can readily access computers, technology, scientific equipment and tools to innovate. Common features of hackerspaces include plenty of tabletops and workbenches, a video projector for presentations, computers loaded with video editing software, small hand tools, benchtop power supplies, 3D printers and related goods, scientific supplies and equipment, a lending library of books and journals and of course, computers.

The value of hackerspaces is that they, like traditional libraries, democratise educational tools. Developing an app or editing a video at home requires hundreds, if not thousands, of pounds worth of investment. This is an obvious hurdle for many people looking to innovate. By pooling our resource and making technology available we can encourage entrepreneurial activity and create a visible place for companies to showcase new products and recruit talented people from a diverse set of backgrounds. We can also help breathe new life into the high street by promoting a community of people, young and old, who can come together to share ideas, teach one another and participate in the use and development of free software.

Libraries are a valuable public institution but we need to accept that their days in their current form are numbered. If we don't soon reconsider how they can become more relevant to our modern needs then we run the risk of losing them and everything they represent. That would be a serious mistake. Converting some public libraries into hackerspaces would be a step in the right direction.
